

BIBLE STUDY: ECCLESIASTES

The biblical book of Ecclesiastes is different. It's reflective, philosophical, and sometimes pretty pessimistic. We're going to spend four weeks in November on Sunday mornings with it in a special Bible Study time at 9 a.m., before church. We'll meet downstairs in the Children's Choir Room. No special study book is needed, only a bible. If you have questions, be sure to ask Rev. Jason.



I've been listening to the *Me Too* campaign as it's lived on social media. After the allegations over Hollywood producer Harvey Weinstein's years of

sexual harassment, many women have shared their *Me Too* stories of inappropriate comments, advances, and even rape that they've endured. It's been humbling for me to read these stories. I know these things happen, but as a man I often live oblivious to the humiliations many women endure. I remember a female friend telling me she always parks in a well lit area and has her keys in hand long before she gets to her car. As a man, these are things I don't think about, but women do daily. It's been hard for me to read, too, stories of women I know, who are a part of church life, who've told stories of unwanted advances and groping they've experienced in church settings, even from some ministers. These are things that have been swept under the rug far too often, and I appreciate the courage of so many women telling their stories and allowing these things to be seen in the light of day.

We know, as Christians, that these actions are wrong. We know every person is a beloved creation of God, worthy of dignity and respect. When one gender gets regularly treated as an object and not as a person, we fall short of the dignity God ascribes to every human. And for my fellow men: It's not enough to just say we don't do these things. I know I've witnessed other men engaging in these behaviors, and we, too, must have the courage to say "No" to our fellow men when we see another acting this way.

A few years ago, I was visiting with a high school friend who had young daughters. He was worried about what his girls would face when they became young women. Let's work so that they, and all women, have nothing to fear in life. I appreciate the courage of the women who have shared their *Me Too* stories, which call us all to a better, more just way of life.
