

# **BIBLE STUDY: ECCLESIASTES**

The biblical book of Ecclesiastes is different. It's reflective, philosophical, and sometimes pretty pessimistic. We're going to spend four weeks in November on Sunday mornings with it in a special Bible Study time at 9 a.m., before church. We'll meet downstairs in the Staff Room (also known as the Chi Rho Room). No special study book is needed, only a bible. If you have questions, be sure to ask Rev. Jason.



I was away in Arizona a couple of weeks ago for a retreat, and I learned one of the retreat leaders, who lives in Atlanta, grew up in St. Louis. I told him I grew up near St. Louis, in Washington, Missouri, and he told me he'd been to Washington. He mentioned the bus company there, and I said, "That's my Dad's company!" We got to talking, and he told me his family, when he was a young man, would take bus tours. He asked, "Was your dad Ralph?" I said, no, that was my grandpa. He mentioned a tour his family took, out west in the 60's, where my grandpa drove the bus, and the tour took two weeks. The retreat leader said, "Your grandpa made a big enough impression on me that I still remember his name all these years later."

We go through life wondering if what we do really matters. A smaller group of us are studying Ecclesiastes now, and the writer of Ecclesiastes wrestles with this question: "Does anything really matter?" Any of us can wonder about that, when we go through the day questioning if anything we do really has any lasting value. The connection with the retreat leader, who remembered my grandpa all these years later, tells me that we can make a lasting difference.

Our lives preach a sermon, whether we realize it or not. Whenever I do a funeral, I'm usually wrestling with the question, "What does this person's life say to us?" How we live our lives says something to those around us, for good or bad. We live our lives as Christians in the light of the love of God, and what we say and do, hopefully, reflects it. We might find, just as I did with the man who met my grandpa, that we make an impression that lasts.
