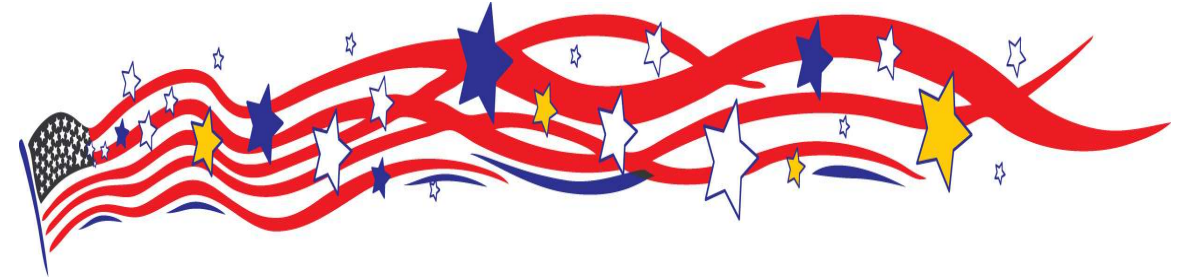

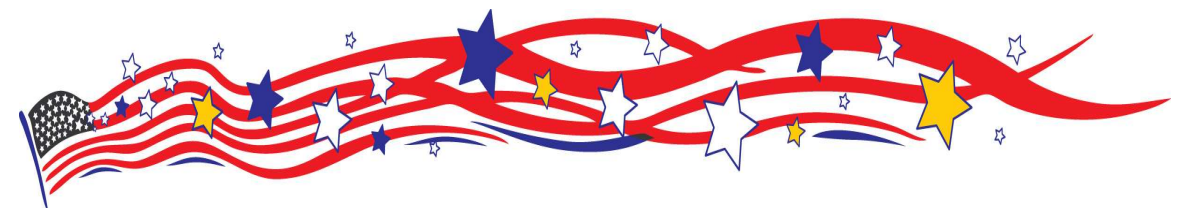


FREEDOM AND DEMOCRACY WORSHIP SERVICE

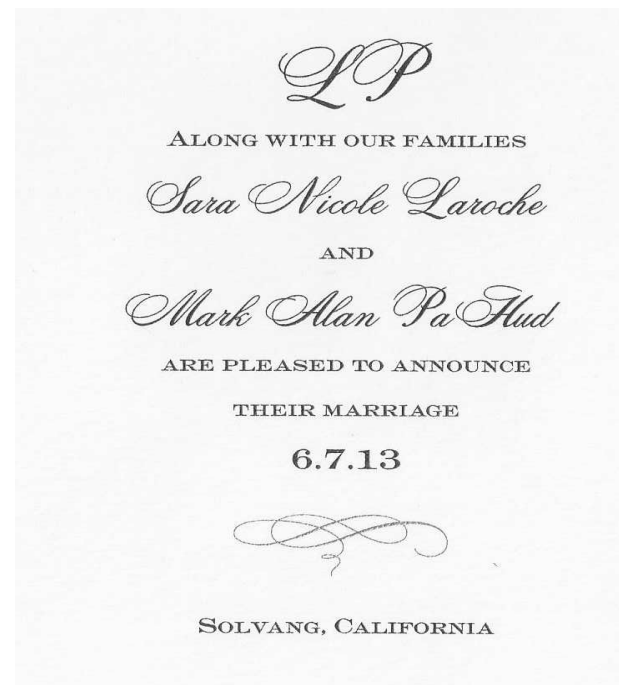
