

Years ago, a couple weeks into the season of Easter, I preached a sermon titled Easter Hope Lives On. A guy asked me before worship, "Didn't we have Easter a couple weeks ago?" I explained Easter is more than just one day, it is a season of 50 days. We often forget Easter is more than just a day but is a season celebrating the resurrection. The liturgical colors in the church stay white. We worship, through the season, with the joy of knowing Jesus is risen.

Lent and Advent get a lot of focus in church life as particular seasons. During Advent the church is decorated, and we light the candles on our Advent wreath. During Lent people often take on spiritual disciplines to give extra focus to the season. During the season of Easter, though, we're a little confused about what to do.

Here's my suggestion: during this season of Easter, you might take on a special way to celebrate the resurrection. Find one way to celebrate the life Jesus gives. It could be the practice of taking a walk each day, where the signs of spring are all around you. It could be a weekly ice cream date with a friend, where there's joy in being together around something sweet that awakens new life in you and your friendship. It could be that each morning you sing the chorus *Alleluia*, where the simple words of praise focus your heart on the good news of this season.

Throughout the Easter season I'm preaching on joy, so find something that brings you joy through this time. However you choose to experience the season, may you know the good news that Jesus is risen during these days.
