# PASTOR JASON'S

There are people in my life who are easy to love- my family, my friends. Most of the time love comes effortlessly toward them. I love them because it's easy to love them, and they love me right back. Some in life, though, are hard to love. Some I dislike, some have done me harm, and some I'm just more comfortable hating than loving. Jesus tells us, "But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who harass you so that you will be acting as children of your Father who is in heaven" (Matt 5:44-45).

All kinds of people show up in churches. Most of the time it's easy to love one another in church. The best people I've known in life are people I've met in churches and loving them isn't any challenge at all. I know, though, if you hang around a church long enough you'll find someone who is a challenge to love. It's inevitable that eventually you'll meet someone who rubs you the wrong way or has a different idea about how to do things, and you'll find love is a challenge. It's with that person, Jesus says, our faith comes into action; where we love those we'd prefer not to love.

How do you do that? First, you pray. You pray for that person, praying God would bless him or her and change your own heart toward them. You might find it hard to dislike someone after praying for them every day. Two, you act with goodwill toward that person. Complement the person who makes you uncomfortable; offer to help them. If anything, refrain from saying something bad about the person you dislike, and you might find your attitude toward them changing.

I've heard it said that one of the benefits of being in a church that isn't huge is we can't hide from those we dislike. In a megachurch a person can be anonymous and never have to deal with a challenging relationship. In a less-than-mega church, we can't always hide, and maybe there's a hidden blessing there. Maybe God is teaching us through those relationships, and when we learn to love that person who is a little harder to love, we grow to be a little more like God.

Music is only one of the many components of the worship service here at Hazelwood, though it is one many of us look forward to. Something we hope you will keep in mind is while you may not like a particular song or type of music, another person does. As Christians, we are called to show love and compassion to one another. One way to do that is to sing a song that isn't what we would normally choose, but we sing that song to include another who might prefer it. We realize there is certainly a learning curve involved with singing new styles of music. While some of us are learning worship songs, others are learning hymns. #### THE LIFE OF A STUDENT PASTOR




