

## ALL-YOUTH FELLOWSHIP

AYF is a time of fun, fellowship, food, and growing in our faith. Here's a sneakpeek into some of the things we are up to:

Our high school group is focusing on Christian living through *The Simpsons* (there's a side to Homer and Bart you don't often hear about!).

#### **BALL STATE HOMECOMING PARADE PARKING**


Saturday, October 21, 2017 8 a.m.– Noon
