

When I say the word "hospitality," you probably think of the hotel and restaurant industries, or think of having some guests over for a dinner party. Maybe we've lost the real sense of the word. When the New Testament uses the Greek word for hospitality, *philoxenia*, it means to love the stranger. So when we're talking as Christians about hospitality, we're talking about more than just a nice dinner at a restaurant or at a friend's home on a Saturday night; we're talking about a love for the one we don't know that transforms a stranger into a friend.

One of my favorite bible verses is Hebrews 13:2, which tells us, "Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it." I love this idea of angelic beings in disguise, blessing us through the drawing out of our hospitality. Maybe what it's telling us is when we love the stranger, we are the ones who are blessed. Jesus tells us in Matthew 25 that whenever we show love to the hungry, the sick, those imprisoned, and the stranger, we're showing love to Jesus himself. We meet Jesus whenever we show hospitality to those in need. The miracle of hospitality is it's not only the stranger who is welcomed who receives a gift, but those who show the hospitality receive a gift in that something holy happens in the welcome they extend.

So many churches are bunkered down against the world, afraid of what is lurking outside. When hospitality is lived out, there's an understanding that the outside might be where the blessing is waiting to be found. The new ethnic group moving in, the kids skateboarding on the church parking lot, the special needs person who shows up in worship disrupting the normal order--when these folks are loved and welcomed, we meet Christ there and find the blessing.

We're afraid of the stranger today. We bolt our homes against the stranger and arm ourselves against a hypothetical intruder. But our faith as Christians leads us to extend ourselves toward the stranger rather than building a wall against her or him. Maybe the stranger--the other, the one who is "out there" and not "in here"--is the one, when loved, who will bring the blessing.

Anyone 7 years and older is welcome to participate. For those over 65, the high-dose vaccine recommended by the CDC will be provided.

As an added bonus, Walgreens is currently running their Get a Shot. Give a Shot. Program. This program provides lifesaving vaccines to families in developing countries through the United Nations Foundation's <a href="mailto:Shot@Life">Shot@Life</a> campaign.
