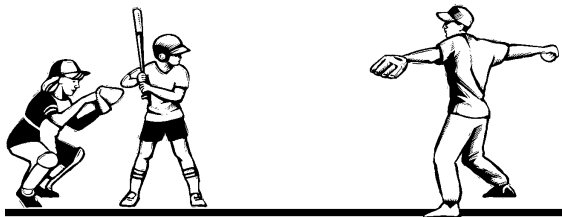


Springtime is Softball Sign-up Time

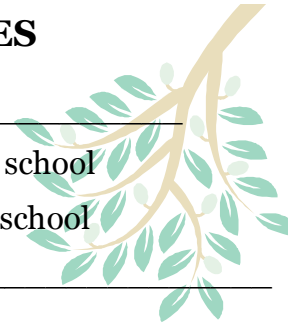

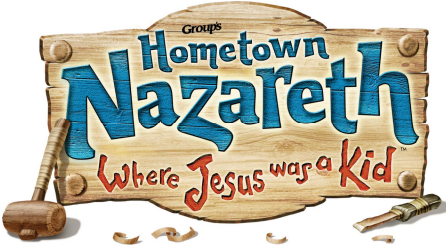
