

EPIPHANY PROGRAM

Our congregation is excited to participate in the Hope Partnership Epiphany Program. This program will allow Hazelwood to take a look at not only who and what we are, but where it is we want to go as we look to the future. Everybody is welcome to be involved with this process as we build a stronger, more viable Hazelwood.

There is good news regarding how the church will be paying for the \$6,000 cost of participating in this program. The Disciples of Christ Regional Office in Indianapolis has generously agreed to pay one-half of the fee. The Hazelwood Board of Trustees has agreed to pay the remaining half using funds received over the years from memorial gifts given in memory of beloved Hazelwood members who have passed away. What a wonderful way for our past members, who loved this church, to participate in a program that will guarantee a stronger Hazelwood for the future!

We'll have a special Sunday that day as we celebrate what God has already done here and what God is yet to do.
