

If you live long enough, you will have some scars. They might be from a surgery or an accident. It could be a cesarean section scar, or it might be from a burn or the wear that a body knows over time. Every now and then I notice the scar on my index finger, a reminder that when I was 7 or 8 I slammed my finger in the car door (not my finest moment) and needed stitches to close the wound. There are others, too, marks and wounds and places where my body was altered. For many of us the scars aren't visible, but our hearts are scarred by pain and disappointment which left us hurt and broken in places unseen by the visible eye. Whatever the scar is, it's a reminder that this thing happened, that our bodies were marked by some type of violence or repair.

Christ, after his resurrection, shows his followers his wounds. I forget it, but Jesus rose to life with wounds. In my misguided imagination Jesus emerges from the tomb perfect and pure, with skin like a newborn baby's. According to the gospels, though, Jesus comes from the tomb with the wounds of Good Friday still visible. In Luke's gospel Jesus shows his followers his hands and feet to prove he is not a ghost. In John's gospel he shows his followers his hands and side, and when Thomas, who missed out on the first viewing, still isn't convinced, Jesus comes again, inviting Thomas to touch the wounds and know that Jesus is alive. Jesus says to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe" (John 20:27 NRSV), and in the showing of Jesus' wounds, Thomas believes.

I don't know what life in the resurrection will look like, when all of God's people are gathered, and God restores all things. I wonder, though, if like Jesus we will still have our scars. I don't know, but I'm guessing it might be, because I believe our faith is not about the erasing of the hard things of this world, but it's about knowing God can be found in even the darkest places, like the cross on Good Friday, and even from there God can bring life. May you know that, whatever your scars may be, as we journey ahead as Easter people.

Never Fear... Our Youth Are Here!

Whether you need an extra set of hands or simply have some chores you just don't want to do yourself, you can now Rent-a-Youth to help you out! Here are just a few of the many tasks they are eager to help with:

Indoors: laundry, vacuuming, dusting, scrubbing floors, washing dishes, cleaning windows, cleaning bathrooms, organizing, and washing woodwork

Outdoors: planting, weeding, washing vehicles, cleaning patio furniture, yard clean-up, and watering plants

Pets: walking dogs, bathing pets, and (the ever-dreaded) poop pick-up of your yard

Kids: tutoring and babysitting

There are a few things we ask from you:

- ⇒ Please expect to have at least 2 youth helping out. Safety and transparency are important, especially so when youth are involved!
- ⇒ We provide the elbow grease, but ask that you provide whatever supplies are necessary for the task you have.
- ⇒ We've listed quite a few tasks our youth are able to help with, but if you need help with a task not on the list, contact Rev. James. Odds are we can help with that, too!
- ⇒ How much you pay is up to you, but we suggest \$10 per hour per youth (this is a fundraiser, after all!) All funds raised will go toward the youth missions trip to *Give Kids the World* in June.

MISSIONS update

WINNIE'S KIDS

A note from Winnie:

"Here is a brief history of the Kenya project, specifically with regards to the Shivembe Primary School and Mama Ni Mama women's group:

The church has been supporting the Shivembe Primary School and Mama Ni Mama women's group since 2009. During that time we have been able to do the following:

- We buy school uniforms for the students every year (students are required to have a school uniform in order to attend school). We started by providing uniforms to only 44 students. Last summer we provided uniforms to 225 students all the kids that needed a uniform got one!
- We provide school supplies yearly (pens, pencils, erasers, pencil sharpeners, and crayons).
- · We provide pain medication yearly.
- We provide sanitary pads for the older girls (since 2015).
- We have also been able to help the school build 10 latrines (outhouses/toilets), a kitchen, 2 additional classrooms, start a lunch program, and buy a farm to plant their own corn and beans for lunch. This year, we plan to help them build a library since the kids have become very motivated in reading but have no space for it.
- We have also been supporting the Mama Ni Mama women's group to take care of their 55 children. For the women's group, we usually provide school supplies, medicine, sanitary pads, and cash money to help them with their small business. At the moment, each woman has a cow as a result of this support."

During the month of April, we will be accepting donations to help 'Winnie's Kids' in Kenya. Each donation received will be matched, up to a total of \$1,000, from the Missions & Benevolence Sulanke Trust. Please mark all contributions 'Winnie's Kids,' place it in either a red-bordered or pew envelope, and add it to the offering plate during Sunday morning worship (if writing a check, it would greatly help our bookkeeper if you write a separate check from your regular offering). We will present Winnie with our offering on 'Kenya Day,' Sunday, May 6 (this is a change to the date printed in the previous newsletter). There are great needs in Kenya, so please prayerfully consider how you can help 'Winnie's Kids.'
