



I'm the type of person who prefers to work out of the spotlight rather than to be the one leading the parade on any issue. I know it sounds funny for someone who speaks in public every week, but I'd rather quietly work for what's right than announce it through a megaphone. All of that means I'm usually not the first leading the charge on whatever issue of the day. I know many pastors who quickly write letters to the editor and preach from the pulpit about the significant issues of the moment. Maybe it's wrong, but that's never been my style. There are issues, though, where I know I can't stay silent. Sometimes the person inside me who'd rather quietly work behind the scenes has to take a back seat to the person who needs to speak out. I'm at a moment like that now.

Over the past week or two it's come out in the news that our country is separating immigrant families at our border. Families who are trying to enter our country without documentation have been separated and children of these families kept separate in detention centers. Certainly we can, as people who believe in the welcoming, transforming love of God, say this practice is wrong. I can't imagine what is going through these families' minds right now as children don't understand what has happened, and parents don't know where their children are. Imagine being a child separated from your parents, or imagine your young child taken away from you. Surely we can all agree this practice is immoral.

Our country has, in the past, prided itself on being a moral nation. We've known ourselves as being a "city set on a hill," an example of liberty and fairness to the rest of the world. Can I say I've seen our country take a step away from that ideal, though, where we're more likely to blame the outsider and the person seeking a place of safety and freedom here? I realize we need laws to govern who comes to our country and how, and those who enter this country need to understand these laws, but diverse voices from people like Oprah, Laura Bush, and Franklin Graham, as well as faith leaders of many different denominations have joined in saying this practice of separating families is wrong.

There are times when I can't stay silent, and this is one. This practice of separating children from families is wrong.

EPIPHANY PROCESS: UPDATE

Our Epiphany process is moving forward! We had our second retreat on June 8 & 9, with a smaller group of eleven church leaders meeting to work with Bill Lawser, our retreat leader. We spent a lot of time looking at the evaluation of our congregation that was created by Hope Partnership. This evaluation looks at where our congregation is and what the needs of our community are. Also, a few in the retreat went out and interviewed community leaders, asking them what they saw the needs of Muncie to be. Participants in the retreat all spent some time writing a future story for the congregation, an example of what the future might be for our church.

These future stories were very hopeful, where we envisioned ministries and opportunities for our congregation. I heard lots of hopes for ministries that reach out to the needs of Muncie in these stories. A smaller group, made of up of Tony Gill, Ann Wolfe, Rev. James, and me, is now at work distilling these stories into one story that we can present to the congregation. We'll, sometime in the near future, be presenting what we think can be the future story of our church, a direction we're headed. We'll also be presenting a capacity plan to go with the story, a nuts and bolts explanation of how we think this story can happen.

I believe Hazelwood Christian Church has a vibrant story ahead of it. I have a friend, Rev. Cynthia Langston Kirk, who says, "Never underestimate the power of a story." She's right; a powerful and moving story can motivate us toward a positive future. I'm excited how the Epiphany Process will lead us into that story.
