It's been over a year since our church moved out of the Sulanke Fellowship House. The sale on it closed last September, and Parlour Salon started its business there this year. With leaving it, a whole lot of changes have happened with the physical space our church uses, and we needed to relocate our offices. We moved our offices to temporary office space in the basement, and we did it with the expectation that we would build office space.

Pastor Jason's Journal, continued...

The Trustees have been working over the past year to make a plan for this new office space. A friend of mine from NW Indiana who owns a construction business was gracious enough to donate architectural services, and with the help of an architect we created a plan for an office wing which would have sat where the existing playground is, with access to the building through the little used doors outside the kitchen and Cartwright Hall. In May we put the plans out to bid and secured three bids for construction. When we began the process, many told us a reasonable expectation was \$100 to \$125 a square foot for new construction. With that expectation we were hoping for a project costing around \$225,000. When we received the bids for construction the lowest was \$360,000 and the highest was \$480,000. These prices did not include the cost of relocating the playground. We realized the project would probably, when all was completed, cost over \$400,000. These prices would have required the church borrowing money, and with the church reaching to meet its basic financial needs this year, the Trustees voted to not go forward with the new construction.

We do recognize, though, that the temporary office space we've created in the basement isn't suitable as a long-term solution. The Trustees agreed to hire an architect or space expert to work with us on converting existing space within our building into permanent office space. There are many ideas on how to do that, but look for news soon on how we might use some of our existing space to make permanent offices.

Can I say something encouraging here? I know when a plan doesn't become a reality people get depressed or worried, but let me say something encouraging. I believe our church has a vibrant future ahead of it. We have people who love God and love the community, and you've shown me you're committed to the life and future of Hazelwood Christian Church. One thing I've been saying is our church has a rich future ahead of it, but we'll need to operate leaner than in the past. We're entering new times to be church, and in the future churches will probably have less money and fewer people than they might have had in the past. Does that mean churches will be less significant? Absolutely not. We still have good things to do; it only means we'll do so understanding existing and coming generations are less likely to attend or give to a church, and that means we adapt how we operate so that we can be effective for the future. So as I see us choosing not to take on an expensive construction project, I look at this and say, "This may be a good thing, because it teaches us to be creative with the resources we already have rather than stretching to meet something we may not be able to afford."

Through all this, too, I'm trusting God will lead us, and I look forward to what might be.

We spent a lot of time looking at the evaluation of our congregation that was created by Hope Partnership. This evaluation looks at where our congregation is and what the needs of our community are. Also, a few in the retreat went out and interviewed community leaders, asking them what they saw the needs of Muncie to be. Participants in the retreat all spent some time writing a future story for the congregation, an example of what the future might be for our church.

These future stories were very hopeful, where we envisioned ministries and opportunities for our congregation. I heard lots of hopes for ministries that reach out to the needs of Muncie in these stories. A smaller group, made up of Tony Gill, Ann Wolfe, Rev. James, and me, is now at work distilling these stories into one story that we can present to the congregation. We'll, sometime in the near future, be presenting what we think can be the future story of our church, a direction we're headed. We'll also be presenting a capacity plan to go with the story, a nuts and bolts explanation of how we think this story can happen.

I believe Hazelwood Christian Church has a vibrant story ahead of it. I have a friend, Rev. Cynthia Langston Kirk, who says, "Never underestimate the power of a story." She's right; a powerful and moving story can motivate us toward a positive future. I'm excited how the Epiphany Process will lead us into that story.


HEARTS & HANDS UNITED GIVEAWAY
