

PASTOR JASON'S
Journal

If you're here at the church building through the week you'll see lots of children coming and going through our doors.

Parents are dropping off or picking up kids who are a part of our preschool. On a nicer day you'll see kids playing on our playground. If you'll walk around the lower level you'll see classrooms filled with children. Our preschool brings lots of children and families into our church building through the week for a variety of classes. We have a devoted preschool staff who work very hard making a positive experience for the youth and families who are a part of our preschool, and if you hang around the church on a weekday you'll see them hard at work.

Pastor Jason's Journal, continued...

One of the things I noticed though, when I first came here to Hazelwood a couple years ago, is, at times, a disconnection between church and preschool. Most of our church members are here on Sunday and don't see the work of the preschool. A few people from our church work with the preschool, but it is mostly staffed by people outside our congregation. This can lead to misunderstandings and sometimes a feeling of competition between preschool and church. Between our church and preschool we have two different organizations with unique needs while both existing within our church building, and this can lead to friction or misunderstandings as we both try to work together in the same space. I know, too, preschools are often started with the hope that maybe preschool families will find their way into the regular life of the church, and while we do have a few who found us through our preschool, the majority of preschool families don't become a part of our church community.

I started saying last autumn we needed to do some work, as a congregation, on understanding what it means to have a preschool in our church. We need to do some work, as a church, in our understanding of what we're trying to do with our preschool ministry here at Hazelwood. At the end of last year I formed a Preschool Discernment Team to lead our congregation in a faithful conversation as we ask, "What does it mean to have a preschool in our congregation?" I invited two from our Preschool Team, Julie Thomas and Stephanie Farra, and two from our congregation, Jim Reece and Marcia Miller, along with myself and our preschool director, Angie Lopez, to be a part of this team. During April, the team will be informally asking you some questions:

- What does the Preschool mean to our congregation?
- How could we improve the presence of the preschool in our congregation?
- Would you like to help with our preschool?

You might find the Discernment Team people mingling during Coffee Fellowship or other times informally asking you these questions.

We also want a way we can talk faithfully together as a church about what it means to have a preschool, and so we're hosting a Congregational Circle gathering on May 19, after Coffee Fellowship. We'll gather in Cartwright Hall. This is a chance for us to listen to one another as we continue to discern what it means to have a preschool as a part of our church ministry.

You'll see here in this newsletter a explanation of the work the preschool does. I hope you'll give it a look so you can understand better the work of our preschool, and I hope you'll join us in this faithful conversation as we do our best to listen to God and one another as we discern how we can claim the preschool as a mission of the church.

EXPERIENTIAL MAUNDY THURSDAY SERVICE

Every year, Hazelwood holds a Maundy Thursday service to remember the night in which Jesus was betrayed and handed over to the authorities, which eventually led to his crucifixion on the cross for our sins. This year's Maundy Thursday service will be quite different from ones in the past. Our service will include "The Journey to the Cross," based on the "Stations of the Cross."

Wikipedia has this to say about the "Stations of the Cross":

"The Stations of the Cross or the Way of the Cross, also known as the Way of Sorrows or the Via Crucis, refers to a series of images depicting Jesus Christ on the day of his crucifixion and accompanying prayers. The object of the stations is to help Christians to make a spiritual pilgrimage through contemplation of the Passion of Christ. It has become one of the most popular devotions, and the stations can be found in many Western Christian churches, including Anglican, Lutheran, Methodist, and Roman Catholic ones. Commonly, a series of 14 images will be arranged in numbered order along a path, and the faithful travel from image to image, in order, stopping at each station to say the selected prayers and reflections. This is done in a spirit of reparation for the sufferings and insults that Jesus endured during his passion."

We will have 5 "stations". There will be some walking from station to station, but all stations will be in the Sanctuary. There will be chairs at each station for those who need them. It is our hope that through this experience, you may feel more connected to what Jesus endured during those final days of his ministry. Please join us on Thursday, April 18, at 7 p.m., in the Sanctuary.

About Hazelwood Christian Preschool

As we work toward our goals on the Preschool Discernment Team, we thought it would be helpful for everyone to know some general information regarding Hazelwood Preschool.

- 1. We have 6 classrooms in total: ELC Infants, ELC Toddlers, ELC Pre-K, 2-3 Year-Old Class, 3-4 Year-Old Class, and 4-5 Year-Old Class.
- 2. We have 14 teachers.
- 3. We have our own housekeeper and cook.
- 4. We are a Registered Ministry in Delaware County and have the following certifications: CCDF (Child Care Development Fund), VCP (Voluntary Certification Program), Paths to Quality Level 1 (Health & Safety), Level 2 (Learning Environments), and Level 3 (Planned Curriculum). When we reach Paths to Quality Level 4, we will have our National Accreditation and will have achieved the highest certification possible in our field.
- 5. The preschool is divided into two sections: Preschool and ELC (Extended Learning Center). The preschool classes are held either in the morning or afternoon, while ELC is available Monday-Friday from 7:30 a.m.-5:30 p.m. ELC allows parents to have the option of choosing a Christian preschool as well as a safe educational place for their child to be while they are away at work.
- 6. All preschool teachers must have the following to work at Hazelwood Christian Preschool: a criminal history check with fingerprints, TB test, CPR and first-aid training, UP, drug test, physical, child abuse and detection training, consent to care on file, sexual abuse risk management certification, safe sleep training, health and safety training, Early Childhood and Indiana's Early Childhood Foundations training, and emergency procedure training. They are also required to have 20 hours of continuing education each year.
- 7. Each year the preschool has a variety of special events held at the church to encourage parents and families to become acquainted with the facility in hopes that they would attend a Sunday morning service. These events include: Preschool Sunday, Donuts with Dad, Teddy Bear Tea, Graduation, May Celebration, Picnic on the Playground, Dad's Night Out, Halloween Parades, and our annual Christmas Program.
