About ten years ago, over a whole summer, I rebuilt a fence. My old house had a fence that was rotting; so, section by section, I tore out my old fence and rebuilt it with new wood. It was obvious, looking at the old fence, that a previous owner built it. I saw signs of my own non-professional carpentry--things cobbled together with a "measure once, cut twice" type of non-professionalism. Someone 15 years ago or so before I tore it out spent a long weekend, or a summer, building that fence. I took it all out-knocking it out with a heavy hammer and prying it all loose with a crowbar. The thing I kept thinking was: "Someone, in a dozen years or so, will probably pry loose my work and toss the then-rotten wood away." All my work, eventually, will go in the trash.

So much of our lives is temporary. We all know what it is to spend time and money on something and, years later, find our investment didn't stand the test of time. We all know what it is to work long and hard on something but, years later, find the work didn't last. There have been things in previous churches I've served that I've worked to make happen, but a few years later I got word that the church didn't continue it. Hearing that news makes me feel like the builder in Jesus' parable who built on the sand--when the wind and rain came the house didn't stand.

What, then, lasts? What stands time's testing? I love the ending paragraph of 1 Corinthians 13, a chapter that too often is relegated only to wedding ceremonies. It tells us that a whole lot--prophecies, knowledge, tongues--do not last. What does endure, though, is agape love. "It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things" (v. 7). When we act in honest love, we build something that lasts. When we show giving love to another, we leave a legacy that endures. When we act in love toward one another and the world, we offer something that withstands the winds and rains of time. May that be the kind of legacy we all leave.
